Our museum is now installing a new Environmental Hall and we are in need of an example of a flint core and flakes to show stone tool manufacture. Don Crabtree is willing to make this but has no flint (only obsidian) and we wish to stick with flint since it is an open exhibit that can be touched. In Dallas he suggested that I contact you since he thought that you could secure beautiful Texas flint nodules that were dug up by the Texas Highway department. We have funds for shipment and Don would need sufficient amounts to work with in case of flaws in the flint.
