Dear Dr. Crabtree:

We write to enlist your cooperation in a projected work of reference, the <u>Dictionary of Prehistory</u>, whose scope and method we have attempted to describe in the enclosed prospectus.

If your present commitments permit, we would be most happy if you would undertake to write a definitive article of no more than five thousand words on the subject of TECHNOLOGY OF STONE TOOLS.

The <u>Dictionary</u>, as outlined in the brochure, will include subordinate topics related to the major articles or about material not covered by the major articles. This should enable you to spend more time on conceptual ideas, secure in the knowledge that terminology, site descriptions and the like are cross-referenced and are covered elsewhere in the <u>Dictionary</u>.
