Dear Dr. Markotic:

Thank you for your letter of March 12th and I am pleased to note your interest in experiments in stone technology. This is a fascinating subject and a very important part of archaeology.

To date, there are not reprints on the Tebiwa articles, but one can obtain additional copies by writing to the Museum, Idaho State University, Pocatello, Idaho. In January there was an article on working wood with stone tools - January issue 159:426, but I do not as yet have the reprints on this one. When they arrive, I shall see that you get a copy. Also, I should have an article published in the next issue of American Antiquity on the Polyhedral cores and blades of Mexico. Currently I am working on several papers on flint technology which should be completed in the next several months. I shall put you on the mailing list for any reprints of these.

My wife typed the tapes of the French conference and sent the transcript to Dr. Richard Daugherty, Washington State Univ., Pullman, Washington. You might write to Dick for a copy. Much information was contained in the transcript, as the reviews of Lithic materials covered all parts of the world.
