Dear Don:

Many thanks for your letter of 29 September and the reprint of the obtuse angle paper. I saw Dick Gould the other day and told him the news of your surgeries. All of us are wishing you a speedy recovery and return to good health.

We returned from the field about 10 days ago, and after 4 months on the mountain the re-adjustment to Honolulu is a bit difficult. A couple of light snows at the end told us winter is fast approaching, so we closed up operations after finishing the test excavation of a small rockshelter.

This field season was quite satisfactory, although much remains to be done. The area covered by the quarries is much larger than any of us expected, so that more time is required for detailed recording, excavation, and sampling of workshops. I am going to request an extension of the existing grant, and submit another proposal to NSF for funds to continue work next summer.

After the grant proposal is completed, I am going to write two preliminary reports--one for the Newsletter of Lithic Technology and a second for the New Zealand Archaeological Association Newsletter. I'll be sure to send you copies of both.
