Dear Mr. Shepard:

In reply to your letter of May 15, 1957 concerning the Bruce's Eddy project and your letter written to the Clearwater Dams Association of Orofino.

The Pacific Northwest Power Company has been granted a permit to study the Bruce's Eddy site. They are still very much interested in the possibilities of a pardnership plan where by they could build and pay for the hydro-generation and tranmission lines. Much of the benefics on the Bruce's Eddy project as studied by the Army Corps of Engineers is for flood control and navigation. It is not feasible strictly as hydrogeneration, according to the Army Corps of Engineers, since flood control and navigation in the optimum development of the North Fork of the Clearwater River is so important.

No legislation for pardnership construction has been introduced into this Congress. Senator Chaves of New Mexico has included the Bruce's Eddy project in his ominous bill Senate 497 introduced January 1957 in the 85th Congress. The legislation in this instance calls for straight federal construction. Hearings have been held in the public works committee, the bill has cleared this committee as well as the U.S. Senate with mild opposition from Senator Newburger and Morris of Oregon, who are principal spokesmen of Wild life Organizations and are opposed to the development. At the present time we feel that the legislation will be introduced permitting them to participate before construction time.

We are very glad that you are interested in the Bruce's Eddy project and I hope that you will not overlook anopportunity to give our project a boost should an occasion be presented.
