I certainly hope that nothing slips on this and sincerely feel that it is an absolute must to have a partnership bill introduced. Should the bill be lost we certainly will be able to point with disfavor at those who killed it. Personally, I think we will win because I cannot see how people in Washington and Oregon can vote against it as it would be a vote against the interests of their own people.
