

Curtis Urges Good Water Management

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A. B. Curtis, Orofino mayor and unopposed candidate for the First District Congressional post, said at Coeur d'Alene Tuesday Idaho's water resources must have the "best possible management."

A backer of the proposed Bruce Eddy dam on the Clearwater River, Curtis said, "The Clearwater is one of the major uncontrolled rivers in the country. We're very hopeful we can get the Bruce Eddy project moving. It's one of the vital sites in the Northwest for flood control and kilowatt benefits.

The GOP candidate for the seat now held by Gracie Pfost (D-Idaho) said "The Clearwater isn't the only Idaho water resource we must project and develop. There's the Enaville project on the north fork of the Coeur d'Alene River below Kellogg and the Libby Dam development on the Kootenai upstream from Bonners Ferry."

Curtis is on a swing through northern Idaho, with stops planned at Sandpoint, Bonners Ferry and Fernwood.
