The Army Engineers, in a 1950 survey of the Columbia Basin, found the Nez Perce and Hells Canyon sites jointly offered the maximum benefits from the middle stretch of the Snake; the Crevice site best adapted to development of the Salmon, and the Kooskia the best in the Salmon. All four have been controversial.
