Honor-Winning Bridge in Idaho

Connecting Elk River and Orofino, Idaho, across the middle of Dworshak Dam reservoir, the \$8 million Dent bridge built by the Corps of Engineers has won American Steel Construction Institute honors as one of the nation's 21 most beautiful bridges opened to traffic last year. The bridge, 1,550 feet long with 1,050-foot

center span, is supported by two eight-inch cables. It was built by Hensel Phelps Co., Greeley, Colo., with 4,000 tons of steel in cables and towers. Dent was a pioneer settlement and post office on the bench above the North Fork of the Clearwater. The span is 550 feet above the bottom of the pool in Little Canyon.
