



Planned Idaho Bridge to Serve Vast Forest Area

Stressed to carry 110-ton logging loads and provide forest fire protection access for northern Clearwater County, the \$4,075,000 Granddad Bridge, as seen in architect's sketch, will be completed in July 1972 over upper Dworshak Dam pool. The 1,080-foot long span will replace an old bridge at Benton Creek and will

give U.S. Forest Service and Timber Protective associations a direct route from Elk River, Idaho, to Headquarters, Idaho. It will tie in with a North Fork road to Superior, Mont., and serve a vast recreation area. Construction is by Hensel Phelps for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. (Werner Photo)
