Saturday April 14-1857.  
Left Blackfoot at 10-  
in morning. Paid \$4- for  
toll crossing bridge.

Traveled 18 miles, camped  
at little pond of stagnant  
water, after drinking  
two or three cups of it  
found it was full of  
wigglers. Strained a  
Copper pot- full through  
a piece of flour sack  
and got a table spoon  
full of the little worms  
into. The water looks  
like dirty milk and

did not settle after  
standing over night  
it made the bread that  
I mixed with it look  
quite dark, but as we  
were hungry we ate it,  
some bacon and drank  
some tea, wind blew  
very hard all day.

Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup>

Our horses and mules  
started back for  
Snake river except  
white Cloud & the two  
Sornel horses that I

got from Sorrell. I  
rode white cloud back  
on road about six  
miles, overtook and  
brought back the other  
animals. Saddled and  
packed up and got started  
at eleven. Shot a black  
tail rabbit with pistol  
traveled on until 6 P.M.,  
camped by a snow bank  
where there was some clear  
water in the rocks, fried  
the rabbit which made us  
a good supper. wind  
blew hard all day

Monday 16

The two sorrel horses and  
white cloud, <sup>gone</sup> saddled  
mine and followed them  
about six miles. changed  
my saddle onto white cloud  
and drove them back in  
a hurry. got started on  
our road at half past  
10 - shot two sage hens  
with pistol got to Lost river  
at 3 P.M. saw several hundr  
ed dead sheep that starv  
ed to death last winter  
got a good camping ground  
and put up the tent

for the first time since  
starting, fried one Sage hen  
for supper, fed pretty good  
here think our animals  
will not run off tonight  
hard wind again today

Tuesday 17

Horses all right - this morning  
got started at 9 - followed  
up Lost river passed Arco  
and camped at wild cat  
point, pleasant today.

Wild cat point - was named  
ed by a man by the name  
of ~~Wm~~ <sup>Wm</sup> Ocean, about  
twelve years ago. He

was entirely out of provisions, and shot and ate a wild cat at that point of the mountains. I learned this evening that the man that owned those sheep that we saw dead, is supposed to have perished, as he has not been seen or heard of this spring.

Wednesday 18

Traveled about 18 miles today. Camped at Burns ranch got some mill

for supper paid Mr  
Burnett \$5- for leading  
and feeding the big  
horse from Blackfoot  
quite warm and pleas-  
ant today

Thursday 19-

Passed Houston today  
got two letters from  
Mama, was very glad  
to hear that all of my  
little girls were over  
with the measles, but  
sorry to hear that your  
Uncle Charley was  
so sick, traveled 16

camped in Mr Joseph  
Stettens field, quite warm  
today

Saturday 21

Remained here all day  
to let our animals rest

Sunday 22

Got started at 9 this  
morning, saw two Antelope  
and two little calves toget-  
her shot at the antelope  
with pistol, did not hit  
them they ran off and  
the two little calves after  
them, one of the calves  
was white and the other



shoes seven years ago  
snowed on us on the  
divide. camped at 6 P.M.  
set up the tent and put  
all our stuff and saddles  
in it as it was snowing

Wednesday 25-

Stormed all night last  
night, laid over today  
snowed quite hard all day

Thursday 26

It quit storming this forenoon.  
plenty of snow and  
mud got started at 2 P.M.  
traveled about eleven miles  
Camped at Mr Gus Betts

took supper with him  
had a good visit - stormed  
a little in afternoon.

Friday 27

Got breakfast with Mr  
Bets. got started at  
10 a.m., commenced snowing  
soon after we started and  
kept it up nearly all  
day, traveled sixteen  
miles

Saturday 28

Started early expected  
to go to the Mine today  
but only went 12 miles  
where we found all

the boys camp. they were  
all out hunting. John  
Millicent got back to camp  
first; he had killed  
a small deer and  
brought it in on his  
back. Frank got in next  
he had 19 nice trout -  
that he had caught  
on the creek above us  
Emory + Ervin came  
in later but they did  
not kill anything.

It was a very pleasant  
day. boys all glad to  
see me.

Sunday 29

We laid over and all went hunting. I did not go far as I saw no game, Fred Emory killed two deer and Pete Weaver killed one so we now have plenty of fresh meat.

Monday 30

Pete Weaver went back down the river trapping the rest of us came on here to the mine but John Millick + Fred Emory started

out today, so there  
is only John Ervin  
Frank & myself here  
now, I found the  
house leaking very  
badly and everything  
in it wet and dirty  
It snowed hard all  
the afternoon, ~~and~~

I worked cleaning up  
the house, dishes &c  
we have no yeast-  
powder nor soda  
so our bread is not  
very good for supper  
It is just one month

Today since I left  
you all in Malad

June 9-

My Dear Willie  
I think I will go  
to Sawtooth tomorrow  
if so I will mail  
this to you. I havent  
had time to write to  
you girls but you  
can let Maudie  
and Minnie read  
this after you have  
read it. Minnie  
wanted to know if

There was any snow  
up here! Yes there  
is plenty of it on  
the north hill side  
and it has snowed  
more than half the  
time since I came  
up here. Every time  
it snows the house  
leaks. Today is the  
first-pleasant-day  
for two weeks. I think  
we will have some  
pleasant-weather  
now. I hope so for  
the storms give me

the rheumatism all  
the time, some night  
s it keeps me awake  
nearly all night  
I get up at half past  
five every morning  
and get breakfast  
so we can go to work  
on the mine at seven  
I have the alarm set  
and jump out of  
bed when it goes  
off, I cook pancakes  
every morning. We  
have been out of

fresh meat for over  
two weeks. Peli Weaver  
and Frank have gone  
hunting, they will be  
gone two or three days  
I hope they will get  
some fresh meat  
for all the bacon we  
have now is very  
strong, and we have  
been out of butter  
for some time,  
I will be home earlier  
this fall than I  
was last year and
