Also, a new book; Paul Siple's "90 Degrees South," the story of America's South Pole conquest.

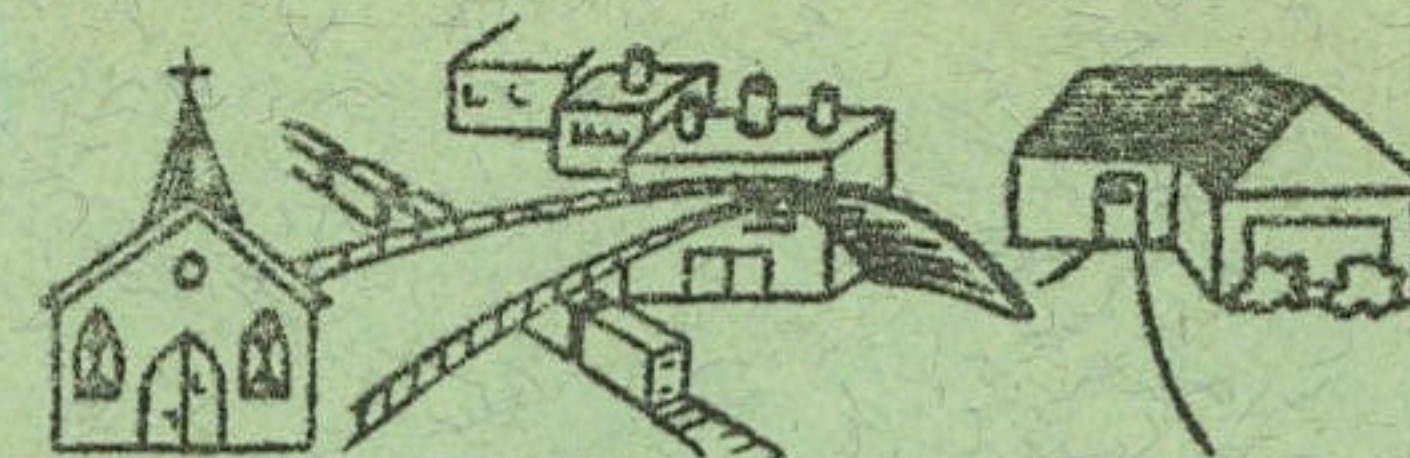
The Library will now be open Wednesday afternoons from 4-5 o'clock in addition to the regular Sunday hours.

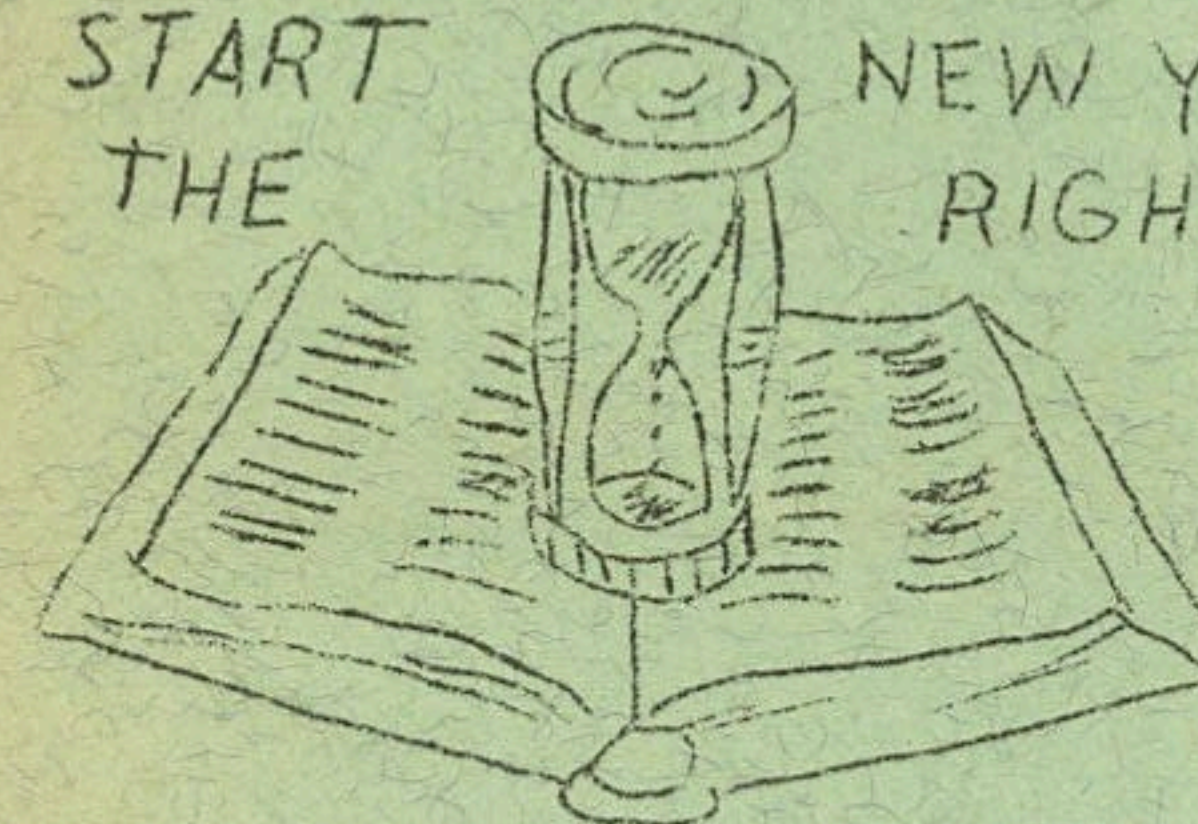

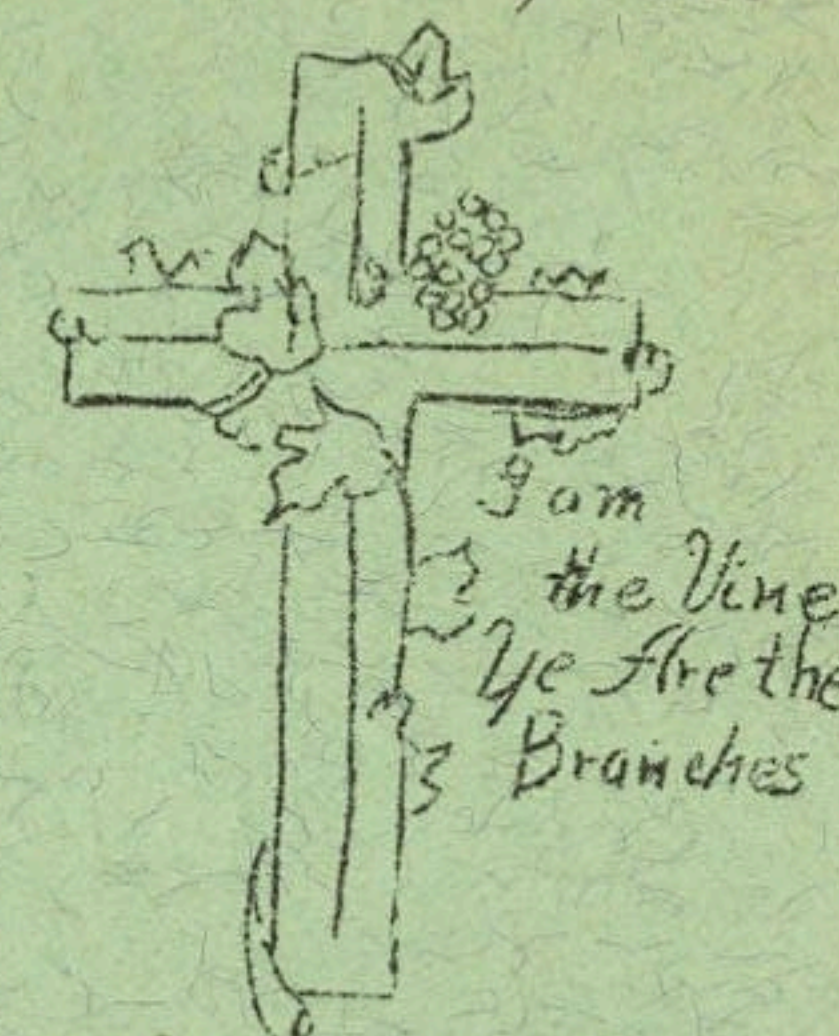
START THE NEW YEAR RIGHT
