Dr. Arbogast Takes Over Presidency

For the first time in Westminster history, the college will be headed by one of its alumni.

Dr. W. Fred Arbogast, who is assuming Dr. Frank E. Duddy, Jr.'s responsibilities as president of Westminister College, is also the first Utahn to hold the post.

Announcement of Dr. Arbogast's appointment was made May 29, by Manford A. Shaw, member of the Board of Trustees and also chairman of the Presidential Selection Committee.

The selection was made from a field of 67 candidates which included highly competent individuals representing every section of the country, according to Shaw.

At the time of his appointment Dr. Arbogast was serving as principal of Highland High School in Salt Lake City.

Westminster's new president was born in Pueblo, Colorado, but has been living in Utah since 1915. He
