History of Standard OHCo.

It was early in 1872 that the producers and refiners in the Pennsylvania oil district were thrown into conaternation by the report that an advance in freight rates would soon be made by the oil carrying roads, which would more than cover the margin of profit then made in any branch
of the oul business. On the 26th of February this new tariff and schedule was put in force, as against all indewas put in force, as against all inde-
penident refiners, but it was soon pendent refiners, but it was suon
learned that the South Improvement Company, or sather the different re finers forming the combine under that name, were exempt from this udvance in freight rates. Conspiracy was What the people termed it; and, indeed, it wan a conspiracy by a few with the help of the railroads to ruin gaged in the oil'business.
The Souih In provement Company was composed of P. H. Watson, president; Charles Lockhart, W. P. Logan, R. S. Waring, A. W. Boastwick, W. G. Warden, John Rockefeller and Amasa Stone, directors. Although Rockefeller did not appear at the head
of this concern, it was he who directof this concern, it was he who directThe railroads that entered into this conspiracy'were the Atlantic \& Great Western, the L. S. \& M. S., Philadelphia \& Erie, Pennsylvania Central, and the New York Central.
Investigation proved that the firat
impressions in regard to the conspiracy and the railroads were correct so far as they went, but the facte were still worse. The agreement provided

From the 26th of February to the sth day of April of that year the Producers Union had maintained the boy-

there were tomen Chere were twenty-six refineries at Cleveland, but twenty were absorbed
by the Standard Oil Company during the three months. It soon became apapparent that the Standard intended to carry out the designs of its parent, he S. I. Co.
By the defeat of the old company, made soon after with the Proiluads made soon after with the Producers
not to grant rebatea, Kockefeller found he must pay 50 centa a barrel more to freight his product to market than his frompetitor in the oil regions, owing to his geographical location. The only way to overcome this was to get a rebate, and get a rebate he did, in pite of the agreement to the contrary and the fact that the state laws were gainst such discriminations. Ac-
cording to teatimony of one P. M. Flager, before a commission of the Ohio legislature in 1879, the Standard was shipping oil eantward for $\$ 1.25$ a barrel, less than the rate charged those nearer market.
From Rockefeller's point of view the "good of all" (all in his concern) demanded the rebate system. He foug ht till be won the point. And when he had won many amaller refiner went to the wall because he could not compete with a business conducted on a plan that did not a low equal rights to all, a plan that is
in direct violation of all laws, and a plan that no honest man can uphold. Rockefeller's ambition to form Rockefelier a ambition to form a
company that could control the entire oil trade had not yet materialized, although he now refined about one-fifh the entire product. Accordingly, he returned to the oil fields in May, 1872, accompanied by some of his collegues, for the purpose of inducing enough of
