This is a transcription of the diary of Roscoe Ellsworth Young currently stored in the Special Collections department of the University of Idaho at Moscow, Idaho. The diary begins on February 14, 1898 as Mr. Young embarks on a cross-country train trip, the first leg of his journey to the Klondike gold fields. The diary ends on September 4, 1899 when he arrives back in Seattle. The diary measures approximately 4 X 6 inches and is covered in tan linen-like fabric edged with maroon fabric binding tape. It is entitled *The Excelsior Diary* and contains many pages of travel information such as train schedules, currency conversion tables, and tide tables for the West Coast. In a pocket at the back of the diary is a lock of reddish-brown hair.

Each entry is comprised of weather, day and date, and temperature above or below zero. Many entries are marked with an "X" and later in the diary Mr. Young marked entries with "DO" which may have stood for "day off". I have added commas and periods where necessary for clarity. When I was unable to decode a word or phrase I indicated my "best guess" in quotations. My comments appear in parentheses or notes in bold type. Mr. Young often placed words or phrases within {}. These are indicated in the text.

Started for St. Paul at about 9 P.M. with B.W. Tinker, Father, Nora, Uncle J. & Ansel came to the train with me.

Started to write some letters but only had time to write one to Rose. Then had to see to getting baggage to wharf, boarded the boat about 8 PM and wrote a short letter to W.E. Thomas telling him not to look for me any longer to join his party. Changed 2nd for 1st class, you bet!

Still on the Queen. Got to Victory (Victoria) about 2 PM. Went to government building and Pd. \$10.00 for a Miners license. Wrote a Postal card to the folks and ordered mail from Tacoma to Sheep Camp, Alaska.

On Steamer Queen having a very pleasant voyage. Were about 3 hours in the open sea, pretty rough, about 1/3 of passengers were sick. I stood it OK and ate a good hearty supper.

Wednesday

On board Steamer Queen everything running smoothly. Getting a little colder, but not bad, just heard that a ship burned at Skagway. No lives lost, but everything but passengers went to the bottom.

Arrived at Juneau at 7 PM. Bought one pr. of heavy boots \$8.50 and mailed one letter to the folks.

Left Juneau at 4 AM. Arrived at Skagway about 11:30 AM. Snowing some but not very cold. Later snowed and blew like blazes! Melted as fast as it fell.

Only one man shot last night. Don't know who did it.

Still waiting for goods and paying \$1.00 per day for board and lodging. Got part of goods toward evening. Found the man who shot the man on Sunday. Was taken into custody by U.S. soldiers. They talked of lynching, but didn't.

Got balance of goods except 1 case of matches. Got them checked off. Hired two wheel cart and took them over to the river in the forenoon. Took about 300# up about 4½ mi. in the afternoon. Contracted for the balance to be hauled to Sheep Camp for 2 cents pr.# in the evening.

Hauled goods from Sheep Camp to Scales in the AM. Laid off in PM on acct. of storm. Wrote to Rose. Went in company with two fellows from NY, took goods up the hills with ropes.

Snowed all day, was feeling much better, didn't do anything on acct. of storm.

Just heard there was about 40 people killed this AM in snow slide, about ½ or ¾ mi. this side of Scales, close to where our goods are. Boys have gone up to see about it. I'm toasting my back. Above accident report about correct. Wrote to Father and Rose.

They found 14 people buried up in the snow yesterday, 22 today. Am feeling pretty poorly. Headache and lame back.

9 more dead men found under the snowslide. I am feeling about the same as yesterday.

6 more dead men found under the snow slide. I am feeling better. Went down to Kenyon City and back with B. Benson to look at his quartz mine.

Laid off on acct. of storm. Feeling OK.

Roped goods up 2 hills about 1000 ft. Bad day, we were the only ones working on that hill. Feeling good.

Roped goods up last hill this side of Scales. Snow slide at Scales, covered up five outfits.

Geo. W. Steele of NY and I went to Lakes Lindeman and Bennett in the PM, 20 miles. It was too stormy to work. We started about 1:30 and got there at about 8:30 PM. Paid 25 cents at L. Lindeman for lunch (supper).

Went on Summit, got a load of 300# of Frt. For Lindeman for which I got \$7.50. Got to Lindeman about 7:00 o'clock PM.

Put a little pitch in boat where it got cracked, coming through the Kenyon. Fine wind started from S. about 5:00 P.M. as we started for Tagish and ran down in 7 hrs, slept all night on board the Northern Light
