Send the title and abstract to the Program Chairman (see address below) not later than December 15 and there will be a spot for you on the program.

Presentations will be limited to a maximum of 20 minutes plus 5 minutes of questions and answering.

For motel accomodations, write to Arrangements Chairman Clyde Scott, 1613 Penninger Drive, Boise, Idaho, indicating your desires (single, twin beds). Transportation from motel to meeting place will be provided.

We need your active help in making this first winter meeting of the Idaho Chapter of the Wildlife Society a flaming success.
