
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Mule and Black-tailed Deer Award Announced

The Western Deer Group and the family of the late Dr. O.C. "Charlie" Wallmo have announced the opening of nominations for the third O.C. Wallmo Award providing for the "recognition and commendation of outstanding contributions to knowledge and improved management of mule and black-tailed deer."

Charlie Wallmo was one of North America's foremost wildlife scientists and authorities on deer at his untimely death from cancer in June 1982. His research contributions, spanning more than 35 years, were abundant and significant in advancing knowledge and improving management of mule and black-tailed deer.

The O.C. "Charlie" Wallmo Award consists of a bronze mule deer (10 inches in height) sculpted by his son Joe B. Wallmo, a wildlife artist living in Loveland CO. The award is presented biennially in conjunction with the Western Deer Workshop sponsored by the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies. The first award was presented in 1987 to Dr. Richard D. Taber and the second award in 1989 to Dr. Richard J. Mackie for their many contributions to the knowledge of mule and black-tailed deer.

Nominations, which will be accepted

through May 1, 1991, must include:

- 1. A brief justification and resume of the qualifications of the nominee
- 2. Copies of appropriate reports, publications
- Supporting letters from at least two other individuals familiar with or capable of objective assessment of the merits of the nominee and the contributions upon which the nomination is based. Both short-term and long-term contributions will be considered. Additional information may be obtained from the Committee Chairman.
