BYLAUS FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO STUDENT CHAPTER OF THE UNIDLIFE SOCIETY

Article I - Name, Aroa, and Affiliation

- Section 1 Mame The name of this organization shall be the

 University of Idaho Student Chapter of The

 Wildlife Society, Inc. Hereafter the organization will be referred to as the "Chapter."
- Section 2 Area This Chapter shall have as its area of organization the campus and environs of the University of Idaho.
- Section 3 Criteria for Affiliation The Chapter shall conform
 to the Bylaws, Code of Ethics, policies, principles
 and objectives of The Wildlife Society, Inc., and
 shall maintain appropriate affiliation with the
 campus or student government organization required
 by local university regulations.

Article II - Objectives and Purposes

- Section 1 Objectives The Chapter may establish objectives,

 purposes, activities and principles not in conflict

 with those of The Wildlife Society. The objectives

 of this chapter are set forth in the following sections:
- Section 2 It shall provide an opportunity for better liaison between the individual member, his state chapter, his regional representative, and the parent Society.
- Section 3 It shall recognize and cornend outstanding work in the profession.
- Section h It shall serve to focus the aims and objectives of the parent Society upon professional wildlife needs, pro-

- Section 5 It shall encourage high standards of scholastic achievement and shall help create a good under-standing of employers; objectives and needs.
- Section 6 It shall strive to:
 - 1. Familiarize members with the general nature and the issues of the wildlife profession.
 - 2. Stimulate interest in the wildlife profession at all educational levels.
 - 3. Establish and maintain good liaison botween all academic levels of the membership and staff.
 - 4. Present for the membership a series of high quality programs (speakers, films, seminars, field trips, demonstrations, etc.) which will further the achievement of stated chapter objectives.

Article III - Chapter Year

Section 1 - The Chapter operating and fiscal year shall begin on the first business meeting in May.

Article IV - Membership

Section 1 - Full Hembership - Full Hembership in the Chapter shall
be available to any student member of The Wildlife
Society in good standing and residing in the jurisdictional area of the Chapter. Full membership in
the Chapter (except for holding office therein) is
also available to valid paid-up student members of

other natural resources professional societies without being valid paid-up student members of The Wildlife Society.

- Section 2 Affiliate Hembership Affiliate membership is available in the Chapter to those persons not members of The Wildlife Society in good standing. Affiliate members shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a full member except he cannot vote on Society Chapter business affairs and he cannot hold office in either the Chapter or The Wildlife Society.
- Section 3 Dues Annual Chapter dues of \$1.00 per semester
 shall be payable to the Chapter Treasurer no later
 than the regular first semester October meeting
 and the second semester March meeting. Hembers
 who have not paid Parent Society dues by December
 31 following billing shall lose their rights and
 privileges of membership.
- Section 4 Resignation Members of any class may resign at any time by giving notice to the Chapter Secretary.

 Such persons may rejoin upon payment of current dues.
- Section 5 Reinstatement Persons dropped from the rolls of the

 Chapter for non-payment of dues may be reinstated

 into membership in this Chapter upon reapplication and
 payment of current Chapter dues.
- Section 6 Charter Hember Members in good standing on the Chapter membership rolls as of June 1, 1968 shall be considered Charter Members.

- Section 7 Honorary Member Honorary members shall be persons

 who, by a majority vote of the members of the

 Chapter, have been thus recognized for their achieve
 ments. An honorary member pays no Chapter dues.
- Section 8 Advisory Hember Members of the faculty of the University of Idaho who are members of The Wildlife
 Society in good standing shall be members without
 vote of the University of Idaho Student Chapter.
- Section 9 Bylaws Each person will be presented a copy of these
 Bylaws upon becoming a member of this Chapter.

Article V - Elections and Officers

- Section 1 <u>Mominating Committee</u> The three-member Nominating

 Committee selected by the Executive Board of the

 Chapter shall prepare a slate of two candidates for
 each of the elective positions, namely: President,

 Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.
- Clauso A Prior approval shall be obtained from said candidates.
- Clause B Said nominations slate shall be submitted to the Chapter membership at least 2 weeks prior to the time of the annual business meeting.
- Clause C Additional nominations may be placed on the Hominating

 Committee's slate at the regular business meeting

 by members in good standing, and provided approval

 of nominee has been obtained.
- Clause D Those nominated must be members of The Wildlife Society
 in good standing. A member may be elected for no
 more than two consecutive years in the same elective
 position. A member may be nominated for more than

one elective position, but may be elected to only one of these positions. The member with the next highest number of votes would achieve the second position.

- Clause E The President and Vice-President shall be elected

 from those members of the Chapter who expect to
 attain, or have sophomore standing by the first
 full quarter or semester which follows their
 election.
- Section 2 Balloting Written ballots shall be received from
 the members by the Secretary and shall be counted
 by the Secretary and two full members of the
 Chapter appointed by the President who are not up
 for election.
- Clause A Members in arrears of chapter dues shall forfeit their rights to vote during the period of their delinquency.
- Clause B An absentee ballot may be submitted to the Secretary by

 a qualified member prior to the scheduled time for

 counting ballots.
- Clause C The candidate receiving the largest number of votes

 (a plurality) on the written ballet shall be declared elected.
- Section 3 Officers Officers of the Chapter shall consist of

 a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

 Their duties shall be:
- Clause A President The President shall have general supervision of the Chapter officers and Executiv Board. He shall appoint, with the assistance of the Executive

Board, Chairmon of all regular and special committees, and he shall preside at meetings of the Executive Board and Chapter and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Hominating Committee. He shall represent the Chapter or appoint alternate representatives to other Chapter, Section, Region, or Parent Society meetings if representatives are needed or desired.

- Clause B Vice-Prosident The Vice-Prosident shall assume the duties of the President in his absence or upon his inability to serve, and shall perform any duties assigned by the President. (Such duties might include chairmanship of the membership or program committee.) In the event the Vice-President cannot serve as the President, the Executive Board shall appoint a President, presidence.
- Clauso C Secretary The Secretary shall be responsible for the
 Chapter files, records, and correspondence. His
 duties shall also include the recording of the
 minutes of all meetings, membership rells, and the
 issuance of meeting notices.
- Clause D Treasurer The Treasurer shall be responsible for the receipt and disbursement of all Chapter funds (dues, donations, etc.). He shall submit complete financial reports to the last meeting of his term of office.
- Clause E Advisors Two advisors are to be elected each year at
 the Annual Business Heeting and shall serve in this
 capacity for one year. Advisors who resign or leave

shall be replaced by appointment by the Executive Board. He advisor shall serve in this capacity for more than two consecutive years.

Section 1. - Torn of Office - The officers and elected board members must be members of The Wildlife Seciety in good standing, and they shall serve for approximately one year, be installed at the Annual Heeting, take office immediately followin; the Annual Chapter Heeting, and terminate their duties at the conclusion of the next Annual Chapter Heeting, or at such time as their successors are elected and installed. These elected to positions in the Chapter during the Annual Dusiness Heeting shall take office at the first meeting in May of the school year in which they are elected, and conclude their duties with the last meeting of the Chapter in April of the following year.

.cle VI - Meetings

- Section 1 Regular Heatings Regular membership meetings of the Chapter shall be held at such times and places as determined and published by the Executive Board.
- Clause A Annual Heeting The regular meeting in May shall be known as the Annual Heeting, and shall be for the purpose of electing officers, receiving reports of officers and committees, and for any other business that may arise.
- Clauso B Heeting Hotice Full members must be notified at least
 one week prior to any meeting when special, unusual,
 or particularly important business action is to be

taken, and the notice must contain reference to the business to be considered.

- Chause C Quorum The quorum for the annual meeting of the

 Chapter shall be over 50 per cent of the member
 ship or 20 members in good standing, whichever is

 loss; for regular meetings, over 25 per cent of the

 membership or 10 members in good standing, whichever

 is loss; and for Executive Board Meetings, three

 members of the Board.
- Chase 7 Estimated Amerulos contained in the latest revision of Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the Chapter in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-laws or the special rules of order of the Chapter or Parent Society.
- Chapter shall meet once each month of the school
 year, unless special business or events call for
 additional meetings.
- Clause F Bylaws The Bylaws of this organization shall be read upon request, to the membership present during each annual meeting.
- Section 2 Special Mootings Chapter Special Meetings may be called by the Executive Board at any time, provided due notice (See Art. VI. Sec. 1B) and the purpose of the call are given. Special Mootings may be called by the Executive Board at any time during the school year, except during official holidays and final week and the week proceeding it.

- Art. VI Hootings
- Clause A Only those items listed in the call for a special meeting shall be acted upon at the special meeting.
- Clause 3 All Clauses under Section 1 of this Article apply as well to special meetings.

Article VII - Hanagoment and Finance

- Section 1 Procutive Board The Chapter shall be governed by an Executive Board composed of the officers and the irradiate Past-President, who has no vote.
- Clause A Conduct The Executive Board shall conduct its affairs
 in conformance with the provisions of those Bylaus,
 and those of The Wildlife Society. The Board is
 authorized to act for the Chapter between Chapter
 meetings and shall report its interim actions to the
 members at each succeeding Lombership meeting. Any
 action of the Board may be everyidden by a two-thirds
 majority vote of the full membership.
- Clause B Attendance Hombers may attend Board Hootings, but may participate only when asked to do so, and they may not vote at such Hootings. The attendance of the advisory members at each Board Hootin; shall be requested.
- Clause C Vacancies If the office of the President is vacated for any reason, the Vice-President shall fill the office for the balance of the unexpired term of the President.

 All other vacancies in any unexpired term of an electric of effice shall be filled through appointment by the Executive Board.
- Section 2 Finance Funds of the Chapter shall be under the supervision of the Executive Board, and shall be handled by

 the Treasurer.
- Clause A The Pressurer need not be bonded.
- Clause B . Funds shall be derived from dues, special assessments, work projects, and contributions.
- Clause C Funds shall be placed in a federally-insured bank or savings and loan association.
- Section 3 Reports The Secretary shall, within ten (10) days
 after an election or other official action taken by
 the Chapter provide a copy of such action to the
 Executive Secretary of The Mildlife Seciety, and to
 the Regional Representative, and section President.
 These same parties should receive an annual Chapter
 financial statement from the Treasurer.
- Section h = Files = The Chapter shall maintain a file containing:

 Bylaws of The Wildlife Society and the Chapter,

 minutes of all regular and special Chapter meetings,

 and of the Executive Board, correspondence pertinent

 to Chapter affairs, all committee reports, financial

 statements and records, and all other material dos
 ignated as pertinent by the Executive Board. A

 "procedure for filing shall be drafted and kept in the
 Chapter file for the guidance of each succeeding Soc
 retary.
- Section 5 Resolutions and Public Statements Any Chapter member(s)

 may submit actions (resolutions or statements) for

 consideration by the Chapter Executive Board. Those
 shall be accepted or rejected by the Board, or a com
 mittee established for the purpose, and, if involving

 new policy, prepared for submission to the Chapter

 membership. Such new items must be approved by a

Art. VII - Sec. 5 - Lesolutions and Public Statements

Actions falling within proviously established
Chapter policies may be carried out by the Proseident or Secretary upon unanimous approval of the
Executive Board. These and all actions approved
by the Chapter membership must be in agreement with
these already established by the Parent Seciety.
Any approved actions outside established policies and
purposes of the Parent Seciety must be submitted to
Council for consideration and action.

Article VIII - Committees

Section 1 - Appointments - The President shall consider suggestions of the Executive Board in appointing Chairmen of all regular standing committees except the Meminating Committee (Art. V, Sec. 1) and special committees as the need arises. Committee Chairmen shall complete their committees with assistance of the President.

Section 2 - Duties of Standing Committees

Clause A - Hominating - (See Art. V., Sec. 1 and Clauses A-D)

Clause B - Homborship - This Committee shall endeavor to obtain the maximum number of qualified possons residing in the Chapter area to become members of The Wildlife Society and of its Chapter. This Committee shall maintain a list of all student members at the University of Idaho who list wildlife management as their major subject and encourage them to join the Chapter. They shall also encourage participation at Chapter Meetings and on Committees.

- Art. VIII. Joe. 2 Dutios of Standing Committees
- Clause C Program This Committee shall arrange programs of all regular and annual meetings and provide the President with a proposed agenda for the annual meeting at least one menth prior to the meeting date.
- Clause D Education and Information (Publicity) This Committee
 shall seek and employ notheds of informing the public
 of basic concepts of wildlife management and of The
 'ildlife Jeciety activities and interests in concurrence with the Bylaws.
- Clause E Resolutions and Public Statements This Committee shall
 receive proposed resolutions or public statements
 from members at any time, and propare and submit
 such items for endorsement and further action by the
 Chapter membership at the Annual Heeting.
- Section 3 Accountability All committees shall be accountable to
 the Executive Board, under general supervision of the
 President.
- Section 4 Tonure All committees shall serve until now committees are appointed in their stead or until the duties assigned to the committee have been discharged.

Articlo IX - Dissolution

Section 1 - Upon dissolution of the University of Idaho Student

Chapter of The Mildlife Society, the Executive Board

shall turn all assets, accrued income, and other pro
perties over to the Council of The Mildlife Society to

hold until such time as another Chapter may be estab
lished in the same area.

Articlo X - Amondment to Bylaws

Section 1 - These Bylams may be altered or amended by a majority of the members voting at any regular or special Chapter meeting if advance notice of the proposed changes per Art. V, Sec. 1B of these Bylams is followed. A member who will be absent from the meeting may proceed as under "balleting" in Art. V, Sec. 2B.

Section ? - Amendments must not conflict with the current Bylaws of The Wildlife Society.
