#### ABSTRACT GUIDELINES:

Abstracts from papers presented at the Montana Chapter's annual meetings are printed in the December issue of the *Intermountain Journal of Sciences* of which the Chapter is one of the sponsors. If you wish to have the abstract from your presentation or poster published in the journal, please include a note with your abstract granting permission to publish.

 Submit ONLY on a floppy disk with a hard copy---clearly label both with pertinent ID information such as name of lead author, abstract title, session, and lead author contact phone number and e-mail address

- The abstract should be a distillation of the purpose, methods, results and conclusions in a single paragraph—the geographical location of your work should appear in the abstract if not in the title
- Use WordPerfect or Microsoft Word
- No more than 250 words
- Single space
- No hard returns within a paragraph

A poster session will be held on March 11-12 during the annual meeting. Projects on management, research, monitoring, and new techniques in wildlife science are always of interest to members of TWS. Members working on projects with preliminary data are encouraged to submit a poster.
