TWS Members, Sections, and Chapters Demonstrate Strong Support for Policy Efforts

In response to President Salwasser's request for assistance last June, 375 members and 28 sections and chapters contributed nearly \$23,000 to the Society's wildlife policy funding campaign. Donations ranged from \$15 to \$2,000. Funds raised by the 1993 *Wildlife Society Investors* campaign have supported our efforts to provide wildlife science to decision makers, primarily through the work of four technical review committees: wetlands categorization and mitigation banking, Endangered Species Act, wildlife research, and 1995 Farm Bill. Funds also will be used to print and distribute these technical reports to members of Congress, federal agency administrators, and opinion leaders. The wetlands report is finished and will be printed early this year; the others are expected later this year.

Technical review committees, composed of volunteer TWS members, are key to the Society's policy efforts. These committees analyze the available technical literature on specific subjects to form the scientific basis for The Wildlife Society's policy recommendations. In previous years, TWS was unable to provide travel support to technical review committees and the great distances between committee members often hampered timely report completion. Recognizing that the Society's credibility in the policy area largely rested on our technical expertise, Council approved funding for technical committees and focused the 1993 *Investors* fund raising program to help finance their work through voluntary support from members and others.

Thank you to the many members, sections, and chapters who made contributions to this special effort. Although space prevents us from recognizing all donors, those contributing \$35 or more are listed below.
