The Idaho Chapter TWS Executive Board met on November 11, 2002 at the Ram Resturant in Boise, ID. The purpose of the meeting was to plan the 2003 Annual Meeting and finish any unfinished business.

Annual Meeting

- 1. The 2003 annual meeting is scheduled for March 6-7 at the West Coast Hotel, Boise (formerly Doubletree Downtowner). Greg Servheen gave the block rates, and the deadline for registering for them is February 10. Chuck Harris said he and Chuck Peterson are working on putting a Rare Animal Workshop together for March 5th. Greg Servheen suggested having speakers on "Tribal Wildlife Management" as a special session, and will call various tribal program managers on their interest in presenting.
 - 2. The banquet will be Thursday evening. Don Kemner is again organizing the auction. If anyone has auction items, please let Don Kemner know.
 - 3. Anna Owsiak will coordinate the Ted Trueblood Communications Award for best student and professional paper.
 - 4. The registration form for the meeting will be placed on the website as soon as costs are determined.
 - 5. It was suggested that a Nalgene water bottle sporting the ICTWS logo and meeting date be included with registration. Dave Musil and Michelle Commons will work on costs and availability.
 - 6. The call for papers/abstract deadline will be January 31, 2003, and will be in the December newsletter.

Other Business

 Chuck Harris suggested for the COWCH program (Celebrating Our Wildlife Conservation Heritage) we could consider having a special session panel meeting rather than individual interviews, and have the panel professionally video taped. The board brainstormed a short list of possible names, including Morely Nelson, Bob Auttenreith and Levi Moehler, and will seek additional suggestions.

Minutes of the 2002 Idaho Chapter of The Wildlife Society Annual Meeting (March 14, 2002)

The annual meeting of the Idaho Chapter of TWS was called to order by President Chuck Harris at 3:36 pm at the West Coast Hotel, Idaho Falls.

- 1. Minutes: Minutes of the 2001 Chapter meeting were read by Secretary Anna Owsiak and approved by the membership.
- 2. Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was presented by treasurer Michelle Commons-Kemner and was approved by the membership. The Chapter has an ending balance of \$10,642.71 as of 3/11/02.

3. Committee Reports:

- a. Nominating and Elections (Chuck Harris reported for Jim Unsworth): Due to scheduling problems, balloting for elections has been extended until April 1. Ballots are available at this meeting, and on the website. If we want to continue with balloting via the website, then a change to the Chapter's bylaws will need to be made. Election results will be posted on the website.
- b. Membership (Vacant): No Report
- c. Program (Toni Holthuijzen): No Report
- d. Conservation Review (Greg Serhveen): Comments on the Selway Bitterroot Grizzly Bear Reintroduction were submitted. Jim Peek gave a summary on the Idaho Grizzly Bear Management Plan and commented on how the formerly unanimously approved plan was being extensively modified by the current legislature.
- e. Information and Education (Vacant): No Report
- f. Resolution and Public Statements: No Report
- g. Audit (Vacant): the Chapter is suppose to have an audit done every year, but this has not been carried through. We need to a committee to go over the Chapter financial records each year as it protects the Chapter and its officers and insures that all is well. It was suggested that all of our records be put on Quicken (a financial record program) to facilitate auditing.
- h. Awards (Kerry Reese): There are two awards to be presented tonight at the Chapter banquet.

4. Other Reports:

a. Newsletter: Dave Musil is the new editor of the Chapter Newsletter. He requests that folks send him information for the newsletter and do so in a timely manner.

b. Website: No Report

- c. Northwest Section (Jack Connelly): (Jack was unable to attend) The Northwest Section Meeting is scheduled for April 16-19. Updates and the meeting outline are available in the NW Section newsletter.
- d. International TWS: The 2001 meeting in Reno/Lake Tahoe was great and the story of the loose bat in the hotel was entertaining. The 2002 meeting will be in Bismarck, North Dakota; the 2003 meeting in Burlington, Vermont; and the 2004 meeting will be in Calgary, Alberta.

e. CARA and other funding:

- 1. CARA was held last fall due to the events of September 11; it is scheduled to be reintroduced in March 2002.
- 2. Senate Bill 990: was passed; it takes Title 3 out of CARA and adds 3 other Titles. Mike Crapo cosponsored and supported the bill; Chuck Harris sent him a letter on behalf of the Chapter thanking him for his support.
- 3. Wildlife Conservation and Restoration Program (Grants): IDFG has \$300,000 available for wildlife conservation and education grants. April 1 is the deadline to apply. A 25% non federal monies match is required by applying parties. Please make folks aware of this grant opportunity.
- 4. States Competitive Grants Bill: In FY02, the Interior Department appropriations budget had \$50 million removed and then \$25 million regiven to them.
- 5. State Wildlife Grants Program: has \$80 million; currently the system for getting the monies to the states is being developed rather than using the PR system. Hopefully by the end of March it will be known how the states will receive their funding.
- 6. Landowner Incentive Program: the system to get dollars to the state and private landowners is still being developed.
- 7. FY03 Interior Appropriations Budget: includes \$60 Million for backup monies if CARA or Senate Bill 990 doesn't pass. The International Assoc. of Fish and Wildlife Agencies and several other conservation organizations are trying to get the amount increased to \$150 Million.

5. Old Business

- 1. 2004 International Meeting: As of the application deadline of July 31, 2001, only 6 people had contacted Chuck to volunteer to work on committees at the conference. With the low interest, Chuck had no choice by to decline to submit a bid for hosting the meeting with TWS.
- 2. Membership Directory: Thank you to Michelle Commons, Anna Owsiak and Toni Holthuijzen for getting those done. They were handed out with at this meeting and additional copies will be mailed to the remaining membership.

- a. Funding Requests: Dean Rose requested \$500 to support the 4-H Habitat Evaluation Teams and it was approved by the membership.
- b. TWS and North Dakota Chapter TWS is requesting support of \$500 to host the 2002 International Meeting. Motion to support with \$500 was approved.
- c. Scholarship Funds:
 - i. U of I endowment Fund: No Report. An update is not sent out every year on this fund.
 - ii. BSU Endowment Fund: No Report. Chuck attended last years donor's luncheon and said it was a very worthwhile event.
 - iii. Edson Fictor Scholarship Fund: No Report
 - iv. Michael Gratson Field Experience Award in Fish and Wildlife
 Resources: The original scholarship fund has been changed to a field
 award at the request of Nancy Hoeffs. It will supplement student
 income during summer research projects for travel expenses or other
 requirements to support field experience. By changing it to a field
 award, it will not negatively impact a student's other academic awards.
 The fund currently has about \$42,000. The Department of Wildlife at
 U of I has committed to making contributions every year for the next 5
 years to the fund. A motion was made and approved to contribute
 \$1000 this year to IDTWS's \$5000 commitment to this fund.

 v. Craig Kvale Scholarship Fund: this fund is currently short of full
 funding and an ability to provide monies for students. The IDTWS has
 committed to providing funding in the past. A motion was made and
 approved to provide up to \$1500 to this fund. Jim Peek will check on

- (e) Bylaw Changes on Balloting: Chuck went over what the bylaws state for balloting requirements; e-mail and websites were not available when the bylaws were written. Discussion ensued about the need to update all the bylaws besides balloting; suggested a committee be formed to look at all the bylaws and determine if they comply with the National TWS bylaws.
- f. Manual for executive Board: Not completed yet. Chuck Harris said he will put together the section for the Past President.
 - g. COWCH: Not very many Chapters have picked up the challenge on this TWS project. It is possible it could be tied to a University project in a Natural Resources or Communications class. Suggestion was made to bring a panel together for the IDTWS 2003 meeting in Boise and video tape the panel session as a COWCH project if not possible to do as a University project.

7. Southwest ID Student Chapter of TWS: Information was requested from and provided to Jim Munger of Idaho State Univerity on forming a student chapter. Boise (corrections)

- 8. Location of 2003 Chapter Meeting: The rotation schedule is for Boise. Possibility of holding a concurrent meeting with AFS or other group was discussed. It was suggested that joint meeting need a common theme to bring both parties together and provide more interactions. It was decided that the new President (whoever that will be) will undertake inquiries on the possibility of a joint meeting next year. Toni Holthuijzen volunteered to coordinate facilities for the 2003 meeting. Meeting dates will likely be in the first week of March.
- 9. 2004 Chapter Meeting: This will be the 40th Anniversary of the founding of IDTWS. Kerry Reese said the Department of Wildlife at U of I would be happy to work on organizing he meeting.
- 10. Paul Harrington Memorial: Chuck Harrrs relayed a message from Jenny Taylor asking for voluntary contributions to Paul's memorial. A motion was made and approved to donate \$100 to his memorial.
- 11. Fish and Game Initiative: Initiative signature sheets area available at the registration table for anyone interested in collecting signatures. Remember, all signatures on a sheet must be from a single county, or the entire sheet is invalidated and all signature signers must be registered voters.
- 12. Misc: Kerry Reese thanked Chuck Harris for conducting the business meeting past his term of office. Toni Holthuijzen volunteered to help the new program person (the new Vice President) with the layout and printing of next years program. Chuck Harris thanked this meeting's sponsors (CH2M Hill, Boise (Boise Corp) and Potlatch Corp) for their support. Jerry Deal volunteered to help with the bylaws committee.
