Land Use Plan for the Lowell Planning Unit.

Our primary concern is that all management activities in the Unit are done in such a way as to benefit, or not cause detriment to, fish and wildlife habitat. Where there are conflicts, we believe that maintaining and/or improving habitat should receive priority because of the suitability of this area for producing elk and the large demand for them that exists.

A combination of management alternatives 3 and 6 would be our choice as the best method of management. The portion of alternative 6 which excludes all further roading in the Fish Creek drainage is highly desirable. However, we recommend that the entire Unit be managed for the objectives and priorities of alternative 3 -- fish and wildlife habitat. We interpret this to mean that no logging, roading or grazing would be done in the Unit unless it could be determined that there would be a positive impact, or no impact, on fish and wildlife habitat. We also assume that management alternative 3 would provide substantial funding for directly improving wildlife habitat, particularly on elk winter ranges.
