

Is the Forest Plan a zoning map?

- Many parallels w/ BLM → Contentious situation for multiple-use agencies
- Conflicts ~~of~~ between res. specialists and between staff and managers

Centralization vs. decentralization

Cites examples of ~~text~~ problems associated a lack decentralization (eg. Dist. Rangers ~~too~~ responsible, Forest Staff officers interfere)

and,

Cites examples of problem associated with a lack of centralization (eg. consistent ~~stds~~ for approach to NFMA analysis and NEPA documents prepared at DRanger level inadequate)

~~Doing~~ Making lots of changes to Std/Guides w/ Forest Plan mod

widespread lack of commitment to Forest Plan

Need to give people some responsibility, make them feel they have a part in the decision making

Problem - lack of commitment to Forest Plan

Problem - Resource staff at SO, controlling purse strings

BLM futures

RS futures

RSG futures

RWS futures

- inefficient allocation of financial and personnel resources

Problem - complete delegation of timber sale decision process to Dist. Rangers level - Districts don't have staff or experienced staff to produce legally defensible documents

What is not said in this evaluation that is important to the operation in CNF

No discussion of resource mgmt other than timber cut not reaching target.
