Hells Canyon National Recreation Area becomes law -- signed by The President FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE -- January 1, 1976

WASHINGTON D.C. U.S. Senator Jim McClure said that President Ford has signed the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area bill. The President put his signature on the legislation this morning.

McClure said, "The legislation signed today has everything we wanted —

It preserves Helld Canyon, while allowing for some tradional uses of the

land." McClure continued, "We have protected Idaho's precious upstream water

rights, and we have guaranteed that this unique piece of America will not be

developed and spoiled."

The law sets aside 670,000-acres along the Snake River. Some of the land will be designated wilderness, other sections of land will be used for limited grazing. A comprehensive management plan will be developed during the next five years. Senator McClure said, "Just as we have had tremendous citizen imput in drafting this law, I am confident the public will also participate in the formation of a management plan."

The Hells Canyon legislation had been shuffled back and forth between the House and Senate just before the holiday recess. Slight language changes were made and it was finally approved by Congress and sent to the President in mid December.
