



Universityof Idaho

A multipurpose institution, the University of Idaho was founded in 1889 by an act of the 15th territorial legislature of Idaho. This statute, commonly known as the university's charter, became a part of Idaho's organic law by virtue of its confirmation under article IX, section 10, of the state constitution when Idaho was admitted to the union in 1890.

When the university opened its doors, October 3, 1892, there were about 30 students and 2 professors, one of whom, Franklin B. Gauit, also served as president. By 1978, the on-campus enrollment has grown to more than 7,700 students representing a board spectrum of social and economic backgrounds. Although most of the students come from Idaho, every state and approximately 50 foreign countries are represented on campus. Since its founding, the university has granted more than 43,200 degrees.
