



Bridgeport July the 29. 1864

Dear Sister,

I Received your letter this morning and was glad to here from you I am geting well I shall be able to go to my compney be fore long I hope thes five linds will find you all well. I wrote a letter to you the 27. and put in it twenty five dollars and sent it to you Father & Mother to ~~to~~ and I shall send some more to you next pay day. you must let me now how much wheat there is when you thresh it and the wool you say you got 74 cents a pound so my wool must here come to 74 Dollars for they ought to cut a hundred pound 26 Sheep. Father you may take that old sheep that I put in with the lambs last fall and fat her and she will do you some
