

Atlanta November.

Dear Father & Mother,

the 1. 1864

I am well & I hope these few lines
will find you all well I have not
heard from you in some time
& Mr. Livingston is a going home
& I will send a letter by him we
have been paid of to day & I
will send 40 dollars in this
letter to you, there has been
a good deal of taring up on
the Road so that we have not
got much Meale nor provision
but we get a ruf. to eat sutch
as it is. Beef & hard tack & coffee
& a little peas soup. we have
got all fixt up for winter
& now we expect to leave Atlanta
in a few days & go fether south
we have got to March & Carry
our knapsacks; I am going

to try it I think I can March
we do not know where we are a
going yet but it is somewhere
near the Atlantic Ocean
the ~~Mid~~ Michigan I was here
I seen bill butter dan starks
Melven starks jim Clark there
are all well & here Moored back
to Chattanooga, Mr. Livingston
lives in spring ^{port} near James Preston
he is a first ~~mate~~ Mate Man
give him a good Meel of biscuit
& butter for Me, Father you
Must take good care of the sheep
& pay the taxes, if you dont want
to ~~not~~ use all of the Money you
May buy me one of them nice
~~ew~~ ew sheep of ~~Q~~ ben silver
& if you need it all use it
I boat for you to send me a ~~fast~~
box but I dont know wether I will
get it or not I hear not herd from
you since I boat for the box

but you must write as soon as
you get this and send me ~~at least~~
two boxes of pills a box of
Roberts pills & send a box of
good liver pills send them
by mail in the next letter you
write, Rap a paper around them
Direct them put ² stamps upon
them they will come all
rite, if you havent sent
eney stamps send me some
they may be some on the
road, There is 40 boys going
home there time is out
Dr Donhue is going home on
a fer low, Rite soon
as you get this
