Dear Sister.. I set down to improve  
my time a few Moments in writing  
to you to let you now that I am  
well as usual & I hope these few  
lines will you well & the rest  
of the folks. Clara I was down  
town ~~town~~ to day & I got my  
likeness taken & I will send it  
in this letter I do not thin it is  
so good a none as the one to home  
but it looks very well I have  
had my hair shingled & since  
have ben in the Army well  
Clara you must excuse me  
for this time for I cant write  
much this time for I am in  
a hurry for we are a going  
to move to morrow it is most  
knigh now we are going to  
Knoxville Tennessee 1865 Mil

you most reach Boston  
the Male & write often as you  
can. I have bought a very  
nice picture it is on a piece  
board it will come in a Role  
the price was dollar & a half  
it will be the engraves &  
Mc Carried Co. & A, you  
put it away till it is  
framed & when I come home  
I will ~~frame~~ it & it it frame  
which will cost 3 or four  
dollars. it is a good thing  
the whole Regiment went  
in for them. it will come  
by Male. well Chas I shall  
have to stop writing for this  
time so good write soon  
is you get this. Ray side. Moby  
Weather go to the <sup>expensive</sup> Money <sup>object</sup> get  
150. dollars I wrote to mother  
letter. & Louisville Ky.
