

Pastoral Letter To All Clergy And Laity of the PSYCHIANA RELIGION

BRETHREN:

By virtue of my election to the Office of Archbishop of Psychiana, and which office under the laws of the State of Idaho has been incorporated as a Corporation Sole, and I being the duly qualified, elected, chosen and appointed Archbishop and to clarify the rules of discipline, worship and obligation as a religion thereunder, it is with Grace and Love that I address this Pastoral Letter to all the Membership of Psychiana.

Our articles of religion are:

"To do Good; To learn how to live; To seek the Truth; to Practice the Golden Rule; To strive to be thrifty, industrious, saving and constructively employed; To rationally and intelligently strive to be happy; healthy and successful and to assist others to do the same."

Happiness and joy are humanly possible, and must be humanly consummated. Within our boundaries we see on every side the dismal failure of antiquated systems of theology.

The time is here. The world cries for freedom from the heavy yoke of wars and superstition. We must count the many blessings that are ours and endeavor to add to them. This has been a century of stupendous progress, this past hundred years, in improving the condition of man, and it must be our task during the century to come and improve the state of mind.

It is a rule and a part of the discipline of our Church that every member spend at least fifteen minutes a day in communion with God. Talking and Walking With God as the Prophets and enlightened ones always have done.

In this changing world of outward things, let us give to Caesar that which is Caesar's and to God that which is God's.

Should any dispute arise of opinion or other matters, take it up First with God, and should conditions necessitate adjustment of rights or obligations, it is a loving rule of discipline in this Church that everyone may be heard by the Archbishop and a determination made in a prayerful spirit, and no such matters may be taken up with Secular authorities until first the remedies within the Church are applied. And under no circumstances can anyone be expelled from membership in this Church except he receive a fair and impartial hearing before the Archbishop and the main rule of any disciplinary proceeding shall be based on the question: "What is the loving thing to do under this circumstance?" The law of love shall then be applied and the question answered according to the highest inner guidance, and thus shall we apply the law of love to ourselves and to our affairs.

It is time for all patriotic Americans to support the Constitution of the United States and to respect the laws of the land. Let us realize in a prayerful attitude that all departments of Government are in the hands of God and that He is guiding and directing. Let us obey in the inner action of love and not through any thought of personal gain, and whatever personal opinion we may have, let us first talk to and with God in a most prayerful attitude realizing the Kingdom of God to be here and now fully active in the affairs of man and in love and equity let us respect those who are in authority, Our President, The Congress and all those charged with public duty and then work that God may be made manifest in our lives and affairs and in the life and affairs of the nation.

Let the Spirit of Love enlighten all Bureaus, All Commissions, All Authority in the Government so that Justice and Equity under God may abide and manifest its power in all things through the Love of God and may we be found Faithful in our Trust to Serve God and uplift humanity.

Come all ye who are weary and heavy laden from carrying the cross of supernaturalism; Come all ye seekers for truth—truth which shall make us free; Come rally to the banner of God under the teachings of Psychiana.
