Dear Dr. Robinson:

About seven months ago, someone sent me your book, "The Pathway to God". It took me a long time to read it, because with my trouble it's very difficult to read, and I cannot get any member of my family to read to me. (They are quite orthodox), That book bore out my previously formed opinion of you, sir. I knew you did know what you were talking about, I knew you had found the pathway to God!

So, later on, I subscribed to your Course, and in spite of difficulties encountered in reading, my belief in you and in your teaching has been re-affirmed.

One night I smached my little finger, (on my right hand) in a folding garage door. I mean just that, Doctor, SMASHED it! And did I yell! Then I said quietly what I ought to say, went in the house, did'nt mention it; wahed my hands, went to my room, and went to bed, and in the morning 'twas all right! Also I have chased away pain, but Doctor, I can't seem to stop the shaking. "Paralysis Agitans" the doctor's call it, and my encyclopedia defined it as "shaking palsy" the same thing, (if the Bible accounts are true), that Jesus healed so much of. Like a taut perpendicular wire, I feel like some one is pulling me from both ends. And the same thing is true horizontally. The tension, and the tensness really is horrible. Now part of your instructions are to be still, relax, and be as limp as a rag. Doctor Robinson, so far that's impossible. The only time I'm still is when I'm asleep. And I thank God for that.

According to the doctors, (again), there is no known lesion to account for this condition, so it's all my own doing. (I've stayed away from any doctor for over a year now), and outside of some vitamins, have taken no medicine since beginning your Course.
