For this world has progressed to the point at which the superior forces of Right must forever subdue the forces of evil. Life is one continuous journey to one goal. That goal is, eternal life, and all that eternal life brings with it. We are now fortunate enough to be living in an age which will see the powers of darkness banished once and for all by the Powers of Light. many modifications in religious belief. "That 'there is no devil' was the assertion of 54 per cent of the clergymen. A majority of the pastors were opposed to having children taught that so-called God-sent punishments such as earthquakes, fires and floods were punishments for sin.

"Eighty per cent voted against teachings that 'hell is a place of burning."

"Of the 500 ministers who answered the questionnaire, only 48 per cent said they would teach junior high school pupils that Judgment day is really coming. Thirty-nine per cent said it would not come to pass.

"The existence of heaven was doubted by 41 per cent who recommended that it be eliminated from church instructions. Sixty per cent believed in angels.

"All were virtually unanimous in their belief that 'God still runs the world.' On the question of a future life, 92 per cent recommended teaching that those who die go right on living.

"Nineteen per cent held that God keeps a record of the individual's bad deeds in a book, while 74 per cent disagreed. Seventytwo per cent supported the Deity of Jesus Christ while 26 per cent were in opposition."

The other day a Student sent in this clipping. I comment a bit and ask why not be honest and deny the entire story as I do? If these fundamentals of Christianity are not true (as I claim), does not this put the church on record as agreeing with me? It most certainly does. The thing the church should be ashamed of is the fact that although such a large per cent of its ministers do not believe in the fundamentals of the story, they still continue to preach and make a living and they do it under the garb of the cloth. They are using the name of God, and are making a living by teaching something they do not believe. This is the rankest sort of hypocrisy, for if these fundamentals are not true, nothing about the whole story is true, and the truths of God lie somewhere else.

That is exactly what we of "Psychiana" claim. More than that, it is very rapidly being discovered that the Spirit of God is operating through

Questions and Answers

Is it not a self-evident fact that Jesus Christ once existed, and was a notable character superior to man, from the very fact that his life, birth, death were the cause of a chronological era styled A. D., or the year of our Lord Jesus Christ?

I have answered this question in dif-ferent forms before. It seems to be heavily leaned upon by Christians who are hard driven to prove the earthly existence of their deity. The proof of the existence of the Christian deity should be so positive, so absolute, that such a filmy pretext as this should not be necessary. If Jesus ever lived (as a God) and if he did the amazing miracles the Chris-tians ask us to believe that he did, thans ask us to believe that he did, these facts, were they facts, would be written across every page of his-tory in letters of gold. If the stars ever fell from heaven, and if scores of dead people were ever raised, this historical world would know of it. Over 300 historians, who lived and wrote in that day, and almost on the evact spot where these amazing exact spot where these amazing things happened, never even heard of them. It is not a self-evident fact that Jesus Christ once existed and was a notable character superior to man. The assertion made by a church organization that anyone existed is not a "self-evident fact." There must be some proof to establish the claim, The existence of the sun's rays is a "self-evident fact" if you stand out in them on a hot summer's day without a hat on. The existence of cold is a "self-evident fact" if you were to be here in Moscow tonight with nothing but your underwear on. But the simple assertion of the Christian church that Jesus Christ once lived is not a "self-evident fact" any more than the assertion that such characters as Aladdin, Sinbad the Sailor, or Robinson Crusoe ever lived. There may have lived an individual named Jesus (Mexico is full of Jesuses) and he may have been put to death for attempting to rule the country in which he lived, or for some other cause, but there is no historical proof that he ever lived.

: Is not Christianity an absolute necessity today?

I can't see why. What has it ever done for humanity other than hide the Spirit of God from men by introducing a god which never did exist? There is no difference between Christianity and any other large pagan religion. If the Christian church knew God and could bring the truths of God to the world, I might say it might be a necessity, but certainly not as it exists today. The whole Christian structure is decaying fast, and it admits it. No true necessity ever decays. No, I do not consider Christianity other than a stumbling block in the path of true religion.

Can your religion bring the peace and hope and joy the Christian religion brings? Can it, when death knocks at the door, give the assurance of a safe voyage through Jordan?

It brings a lot more hope and peace and joy than the Christian religion ever brought. When death, as you call it, comes, with us there is no need of any special comfort and assurance, because the special comfort and assurance the Christian needs at death, we have through life, and on beyond this earthly life, too. The only reason the Christian feels the need of special comfort and peace at death is because he is not sure of his god. He has had to "believe" that all will be well. He has had to "trust" that all will be well on the other side. We of "Psychiana" have no such fears because we know God here, and to know God here is to know God always, hence, no special preparations for death are in our program. It's far better to have a God whom you abso-lutely know exists here and now, than it is to have to "believe" a certain set of church dogmas, and even then you are sure of nothing at all. I want something more secure than the story of Jesus Christ to build upon. I want the actual Presence of the Spirit of God, and I want that Spirit through this earthly life. With that consciousness, you can have the rest of the religious theories of crucified gods, for there have been a lot of them to choose from.

- Ques: Do you know what the best school of music in the United States is? I want to send my daughter there to study music.
- Ans: Oberlin College at Oberlin, Ohio, is not outrated by any school of music in America. It is generally conceded to be tops. My son goes there.
- Ques: What will become of this world if Hitler and Stalin win the war?
- Ans: They might very easily win it, but the principles which these men stand for cannot endure permanently. I expect the next year or two will throw the "Psychiana" Teaching into the limelight to such a degree that it will be the religious power which Hitler and Co. will have to face if they win this war. I don't believe there is much hope the churches will give up their pagan conception of God, and if they don't, I know of no other Movement through which the Spirit of God can take issue with these dictators. This issue of right and wrong has to be faced. This is a battle to the death. The forces of right will win, but it may take a special revelation from God to beat them. "Psychiana" is that revelation. All I am waiting for now is the man or woman on whose consciousness God has laid the burden of supplying us with sufficient funds, and when that person shows up, we shall spring into action very fast, I assure you.

Ques: What do you think of A. M. O. R. C.? Ans: I know nothing about it—what is it?

- Ques: Is there a "Psychiana" branch here in New York?
- Ans: We have no branches anywhere except in The Hague, Holland.
- Ques: When are you on the radio? I can't ever hear you any more.
- Ans: Radio in my opinion has passed its peak and is losing its usefulness as an advertising medium. We are confining our efforts to newspapers and magazines exclusively. I doubt if we shall ever go on the air again—the results last year were not very good.

Ques: Was your mother a Christian or an infidel like you?

Ans: She was a Christian and a good one, not an infidel like you.

Ques: Why did you go to Moscow, Idaho,

instead of coming here to New York where more people are?

Ans: I just happened to be in Moscow when this Movement started. Had I been in your city, I would have started there. But I would not like to live in New York. You find more of God out here in these wide open spaces, don't you know. I am never more lonesome than when in New York. I feel like a lost soul in that town. Too much of everything, and not enough of anything worth while. Give me Idaho.

claims of the Catholic church that it has 21,500,000 members in America, or rather in the United States. When the bureau insisted that the true number be recorded, the Archbishops told their churches that they may deduct 15% for "bad" Catholics, which, I suppose, means those who have died or thrown over that particular system of theology. Then, they stated, another 15% may be deducted for children under seven years of age. This makes a 30% deduction according to Catholic admission. Babson, after a comprehensive report, states that only about 25% of those carried on church rolls actually attend and contribute to all churches and that gives us a figure of about three or four million active members of the Catholic church (an Italian institution which recently threw in its lot with European dictators), in the United States.

That's closer to it. The combined Protestant churches have, according to census, about twenty-five million members of voting age. If only 25% of them attend church, this gives them twice the number of Catholics, so "the great Catholic menace" does not really exist. That church does not control enough votes to materially affect any election, although many a time it has entered politics with its threat of 21,500,000 votes. However, I am not particularly interested in the Catholic church or any other church, only as I can bring to those churches the actual truths of God. I will say about the Catholic church that I personally consider it the greatest instrument of pagan idolatry this world has ever known. No Catholic can know the sublime Truths of God and believe Catholic superstition at the same time. The Truths of God at once cut one loose from "virgin births," "crucified gods," "repentance," "resurrection," "atonement," etc. Those things are but a relic of pagan religious superstition adopted as truth by the present-day church, both Catholic and Protestant.

In the new day which is to follow the present wholesale slaughter, there will be none of those teachings. All men will know the actual presence of the Spirit of God in them, and that is the only place that Spirit may be found—in a human life. hools of Tomorrow

'aking a long look ahead, the eduonal policies commission, joint up representing the National Edtion association and the American ociation of School Administrators, ently announced a long-range naal program which may well beie a pattern for the American ool system of tomorrow. Submitin the name of being a policy ch would help reduce unemploynt and would raise America's ndard of living and total income, program lists three basic points: . Expansion of the American ool system to provide compulsory ool attendance for at least ten rs for every child. Increasing the rage number of years of free ooling for American youth to 14. . Expansion of a well-planned voonal education program to the nt where "boys and girls leave ool ready to enter productive s."

. Provision of free college or unisity training for every child of suior ability who wants to go on h his education, even though he his family are unable to finance advanced schooling.

The public school system would be rganized from its present standard year basis to six years of elemeny school, followed by a four-year ior secondary school, followed in h by a senior secondary school h courses of study varying in gth from two to four years. Bed this universal minimum would he the regular college training for lified students, those gifted ones xceptional talent.

'he views of the commission on this er point are obviously sound. "A nocratic school system will not at all students alike," the report lares. "To pretend that every th is equally capable to profit m the same amount and kind of cation is to refuse to face the most ious of facts. The difficulty with sent practice, from the economic nt of view, is not that different sons are given different amounts kinds of education. . . . The real rce of the difficulty lies in the t that our educational opportuniare not closely enough correlated h individual abilities and social

needs." Put in another way, the commission is saying that more young people now have a chance to go to college than deserve it. That is true. Not every person needs or is fitted for college work, and the trend toward assuming that everybody ought to have a degree is doing some harm, including the waste of a lot of money. Educating a dullard or a butterfly pays sometimes—but not often.

With the general goal outlined by the commission—to raise American productivity, wages, buying power and consuming power through an additional investment in education there will be little quarrel, as it is the American goal for all. For every man to work and earn for himself, with opportunity limited only by individual ability, resourcefulness and energy, is a democratic ideal. That is what liberty means, as most Americans understand it.

To outline a program is relatively simple, but unfortunately the carrying out of the plan is another matter. The report is necessarily vague on this point, the commission estimating that the cost, in the long run, might amount to four billion dollars annually. It notes this total would include most of the present educational costs. and, in defense, points out that the states which have spent most for education have cashed in by showing the greatest increase in per capita wealth, while the states which have spent the least are today poorest, despite high original per capita wealth, rich natural resources and manpower.

It is quite obvious that the straitened circumstances of most states and local school units preclude their now assuming any such burden as is contemplated in this program, hence that the proposed financing must come eventually from the federal treasury. What, then, of federal influence? It could hardly be avoided. If the federal government should take over the financial burden, it also would be justified in asking for the power. And that is what the nation as a whole, and even many of the educators, have been dubious about.

This would be the first practical obstacle in the way of the program for remaking the schools. There are some things to be said on the side of complete federal control of the school

system. The principal thing is the more equitable distribution of educational opportunity throughout the nation. There are more things to be said against it. Teacher pressure on congress might be disastrous for the public treasury and the centralization of school authority at Washington might easily make it subject to political pressure. The educational systems in some states have been made political agencies, it is true, but the trend is in the opposite direction. A federal educational system might also have a tendency to destroy regional cultures which many of the greatest educators of the country are now endeavoring to preserve. Again, a federal system would remove the school system and responsibility for it further from the individual parents of the school children, those logically most interested.

Care and caution should be exercised in taking a step toward even the worthiest end. It would be better to stay a little too long with outmoded practices than to turn into a blind alley. Neverthless, none can doubt that the educational system of America faces a period of transition, and that the trend is in the direction outlined by the commission. The change probably will come as it has in the past, by trial-and-error experimentation until a sensible way is found to approach the problem of a safe passage to new and better methods.-Lewiston Tribune.

REASON 1.

REASON 2.

e Christian bible has no authorvhatsoever. No one knows who e the four gospels in which the s story appears. Where these goscame from we do know-they products of the Roman Catholic ch. Not a single original manut of these gospels has ever been n to exist. The whole composition t known to other religions, and is arily and completely a set of ngs, absolutely unknown in authp, and appearing only in the s of the religion which teaches the books contain. There is no nce of the truth of what these gospels contain, while there is

much evidence that the complete story is not true.

REASON 3.

The fact that no history, sacred or profane-that not one of three hundred histories of that age-make the slightest allusion to Christ, or any of the miraculous incidents ingrafted into his life, certainly proves, with a cogency that no logic can overthrow, no sophistry can contradict, and no honest skepticism can resist, that there never was such a miraculously endowed being as his many orthodox disciples claim him to have been. The fact that Christ finds no place in the history of the era in which he livedthat not one event of his life is recorded by anybody but his own interested and prejudiced biographerssettles the conclusion, beyond cavil or criticism, that the godlike achievements ascribed to him are naught but fable or fiction. It not only proves he was not miraculously endowed, but proves he was not even naturally endowed to such an extraordinary degree as to make him an object of general attention. It would be a historical anomaly without a precedent, that Christ should have performed any of the extraordinary acts attributed to him in the gospels, and no Roman or Grecian historian, neither Philo nor Josephus, both writing in that age, and both living almost on the spot where they are said to have been witnessed, and both recording minutely all the religious events of that age and country, make the slightest mention of one of them nor their reputed authors. Such a historical fact banishes the last shadow of faith in their reality.

It is true a few lines are found in one of Josephus' large works alluding to Christ; but it is so manifestly a forgery that we believe all modern critics of any note, even of the orthodox school, reject it as a base interpolation.

REASON 4.

Born and raised within the shadow of the Christian church, and abiding by its precepts faithfully, I tried in vain for 40 years to find God by its formula. I failed. When I discarded the whole story, and sought God outside of the church theory of Jesus Christ, I found God. What has happened since that date, and the hundreds of thousands of others who have also found God through this Movement, are well known.

REASON 5.

The Spirit of God is being made known to the world through this "Psychiana" Teaching, and yet it denies everything the Christian religion teaches. It denies the story of Jesus Christ, and it classifies the Christian bible along with the bibles of other systems of religion, some of them far larger and older than the Christian religion. If the absolute truths of God were being brought to the world through the Christian religion, they would not be brought through "Psychiana."

REASON 6.

The Christian church, with its "crucified god" "Jesus Christ and its divinely inspired "word of god," is utterly unable to reveal God to man. It is unable to stop this war. The god of the Christian church stands impotent to either reveal himself to individuals, or to give evidence of any kind that he exists or ever existed. Every religious organization teaching the story of Jesus as God is failing at such a rate that "mergers" are talked about in an effort to "save" the structures. The story of Jesus Christ, therefore, cannot even "save" the institutions which say they believe that story, let alone the rest of this war-saddened world. Where the Spirit of God is, there is Power, there is Peace, there is Joy, there is Love. Few of these things manifest through any branch of the Christian church.

REASON 7.

The Christian religion is made up of over 500 different sects, cults, organizations and denominations, and (Continued on page 8)

no two of them can agree on anything. They fight with each other. The Catholic branch calls the Protestant branch "heretic" and the Protestant branch calls the Catholic branch "pagan." They have different bibles, and the man does not live who can make head or tail out of the Christian mess of religion as it exists today. If God were in this religion, there would be unity of Spirit and thought. God, therefore, cannot be in it, despite its claims that Jesus Christ was Almighty God.

REASON 8.

This world is torn between life and death today. The horrors of war are all over. Human life is not held Terrible instruments of sacred. wholesale murder are designed, and hate, both among individuals and nations, threatens to destroy our civilization. There is nothing any branch of the Christian church, or its god, can do to stop this horrible slaughter. Its god is silent as the grave. The church is silent, too. Yet one part of the Christian structure tells the world that it is "the only one authorized to act and teach for God." Yet not only that branch of the church is powerless, but the Protestant branch is also impotent.

REASON 9.

The vast majority of thinking Americans do not believe the story and are not interested in anything the church teaches. If the Spirit of God were in the story, the whole world would run to receive it, and accept it.

REASON 10.

Millions of people, thousands of years before Christ was ever heard of, knew the story of the virgin birth, the atonement, the crucifixion, the resurrection, the "mass" or sacrifice, the communion of saints, the doctrines of hell-fire, and the second advent of the "crucified god" of their respective religions. There is not one single fundamental teaching of the Christian church which cannot be directly traced to "pagan" and "heathen" systems of religion, which had every one of these fundamentals long before the church the Pope of Rome and Constantine (Christian) founded, ever had them. They were all known long before the Christian church ever got hold of them. Therefore, they are not original, and, if "pagan" systems of religion had them all, the chances are they are not true either. Certainly they are not original, and just as certainly, if the older systems which contain these same precepts were "pagan," so is the Christian church, for it contains and teaches the very same fundamental doctrines the "heathen" did.

REASON 11.

Too many other "crucified gods" have appeared on the earth, and attempted to save it, before the "crucified god" of the Christian church came onto the scene (if he ever did). Fourteen hundred years before Jesus Christ was born of a virgin, Jeseus Chrishna was also born of a virgin. Both Chrishna and Christ were God, we are told, and both were born on the 25th day of December. Shepherds and wise men heralded the births of both, and a star guided the two batches of wise men "over the place where the infant child lay." The mother of one was Mary, the other Maia. The first man and woman taught in the Hindoo bible were Adimo and Heva. The Christian bible has it Adam and Eve. (The Hindoo told this story 1,400 years before the Christian began to tell it. Also, the Hindoo Vedas, or bibles, are the oldest sacred writings extant, far antedating the Christian bible, the New Testament of which is older than the Old Testament).

The "righteous man" in the Christian bible was Noah, who had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. The "righteous one" of the Vedas was Noe, who had three sons; namely, Shema, Hama, and Jiapheta (practically the same names-at any rate, too close for mere coincidence). Both Jesus and Jeseus were the second part of the "trinity" of God; both arose from the dead on the third day after crucifixion, and ascended into heaven where they now are, making intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. I cannot put these two stories side by side, considering that one was told 1,400 years before the other, and not know that the one was stolen or borrowed from the other. Reason dictates it could not be otherwise.

REASON 12.

There is nothing in the Chri religion which sustains its claim divine origin. Not one thing i bible took "supernatural" abili write. Some of the things wr therein are so filthy that they v not be allowed to go through the S. mails if they appeared in any book. The main reason I do no lieve the story is because of the potence of any church teachin to bring the Power of the Spin God to the world, or indeed to one.
