BOISE (AP)—Frank B. Robinson of Moscow today filed articles of incorporation for an organization "to establish churches throughout the world" for the promulgation of his faith, and also to set up universities to grant religious degrees.

The purpose of the corporation, the articles set forth, is to "teach privately to individuals, and publicly in classes, the holy bible and Psychiana faith by lecture courses, textbooks, psychological, and religious readings, together with those laws of spiritual and material life existing in our personal image, and the life and spirit of God."

Moscow Publisher Would  
Promulgate 'Psychiana'  
Throughout World.

BOISE, Idaho, Aug. 21 (AP)—Frank B. Robinson of Moscow—one-time drugstore clerk, who turned his religious ideas into a fortune—set up a corporation today to permit establishment of churches "throughout the world for the promulgation" of the faith he named "psychiana."

Robinson a newspaper publisher, is the principal incorporator.

Others are Pearl B. Robinson and W. T. Marineau, both of Moscow.

The purpose of the corporation was recorded as "to teach privately to individuals and publicly in classes the Holy Bible and Psychiana faith, by lectures, courses, textbooks, psychological and religious readings and many other methods customarily used to impart knowledge, together with those laws of spiritual and material life existing in our personal image, and the life and spirit of God."
