'Psychiana' Supports Tom Dewey

MOSCOW, Feb. 29.—Dr. Frank B. Robinson, Moscow, Idaho, foun-der OLPSychiana, a psychology:Te-ligion, said today he would get his 750,000 followers to vote f or Thomas E. Dewey, New York dis-trict attorney and Republican presidential aspirant. Robinson said he was convinced Dewey was the outstanding man for the presidency and that the New Deal "must go." Robinson, who is co-publisher of the Moscow, Idaho, Daily Idaho-ian, met Dewey in Boise when the racket-busting prosecutor arrived on a campaign swing through the west.

His plan re-quired each member of Psychi-ana, the Finnish cabinet and the Finnish army to spend 15 minutes a day in prayer to emphasize the belief that the power of Ged is superior to the powers of war, hate and evil." "Just wait," Robinson said. "You'l see that I am right." Robinson's career, in which he arose from a poor drug clerk to the leader of a religious move-ment who drives expensive cars, lives in a sumptious home and has a private fortune estimated at more than \$1,000,000, was written up recently in Editor and Publish-er magazine. His success was pre-sented as a proof of the efficiency of advertising. Robinson places the advertise-ment of Psychiana before the pub-lic at a cost of thousands of doi-lars a month. They are headed by such phrases as "If you were God." "I talked with God," and "You have at your disposal all the power of a god."
