the NP's does not show when line segments
were removed. The Washington Dept. of Transportation
(probably formerly known as the Railroad and Warehouse
Commission) should have abandonment records
but you probably would have to do the research
yourself. State agencies normally aren't too
receptive to historical research requests.*
