#1 Picture of a bridge removal on the Nezperce Railroad. October 1958. The man holding the tie is Joe Lux, president ^{and owner} of that railroad. Joe lives in Spokane wth other men not known.

Numbers 3 and 4 are also pictures of the removal of bridges on the Nezperce Railroad. Man with hat on, in picture 3 is Joe Lux.

Man driving tractor picture 4 is Joe Lux.

Joe is a successful farmer living in Spokane W[?]

Picture No 2 Engine No 11 of the Nezperce Railroad - runs from Craigmont Idaho to Nezperce Idaho.

Picture No. 5 shows Joe Lux placing a culvert, ^{pipe} in place of a bridge on the Nezperce R^r. All taken in October 1958
