

- 169 Starts. Ask personal data on Annetta Bellows. Maiden name is Annetta Kellon.
- 173 Born April 2, 1896 in Mandolia, Wisconsin. No nickname. Gave address. Gave phone number.
- 180 First came to Idaho lived at rail-station near Springston close to Harrison. Was young, came with parents in 1898. Travelled on train to Idaho.
- 190 Lived up at St. John ???
- 198 Children out of school back then better able to obtain goals. Children today just putting in time, don't care about school, have no objective.
- 206 Mother's background. Name Sarah Hill (maiden name). Was 32 when she died, birth date unknown, birth place unknown. Died in 1907 when Annetta was 10 years old. Married (mother) in 1895. Mother had heart condition brought about by scarlet fever.
- 216 Father's background. Name Frank Kellon. Born in June 8, 1868. Birth place unknown. Died May 17, 1950. His occupation was a saw worker in the timber industry. Later worked with teams of horse which were used in transporting logs. Later then that he worked in one of the mills.
- 230 Brothers/sisters. Two brothers named Edgar and George. Both are dead. Had one sister who died when she was 15 months old. Her name was Marettta.
- 234 Husband. Harris Bellows. Born on October 17, 1888 in or near Renton??, Michigan.
- 238 Married in Goldenale, Idaho in September 1912. Husband been dead about two years when the tape was made.
- 250 Children. Ned. Born in Michigan on November 21, 1922. Occupation - a lumber jack and did some diary and ranch work. Thelma also born in Michigan. Born on May 19, 1918. She is married.
- 257-
- 268 Education. Graduated when she was in the 8th grade. Has only common household skills. Hobbies: making quilts, knitting and sewing. Never worked outside the home. Doesn't belong to any clubs. Occassionly goes to church. Does canning and has a vegetable garden.
- 280-
- 300 Tells about flood, its destruction and the rebuilding they did after the flood.
- 303 Canned 95 quarts of tomatoes at one time, also canned peaches, apricots, berries. She sold extra butter and milk before they started the diary.
- 313 Most of her household belongings survived the flood. Flood occurred in December after a few inches of snow. All melted off which caused the flood.
- 324 Prefers rural life. Likes the quietness and privacy.
- 327 When a child had to do dishes, while brothers did work outside as well as father.

- 332 Went to grandparents and lived with them for two years. Came back to live with her father. Worked and cleaned house, helped raise her brothers. Was in charge of the house. Baked bread and did other cooking. No one to help her.
- 340 She married when she was 15. Grandmother moved in and helped her father out. Her husband has recently passed away.
- 345 Annetta met her husband in Bolville at a dance. Went to gether for several years.
- 352 Marriage was what she expected.
- 356 Had children at home. When ever children became sick the doctor came to the house to treat them.
- 364 She lost her first and last children during child birth.
- 365 Has one grandchild and two great-grandchildren.
- 377 Watches news and other educational programs.
- 383 Never active in community activities and when in Bolville never got involved in the community activities that were going on in town.
- 385 Decision Making: would talk over things together.
- 397 Helped bail hay. Sold chickens, eggs, nilk, butter. She had her children help her with these activities.

- 015 Some companionship with a few of the neighborhood women.
- 044 WWI. Rationing, none of her family involved in the war.
- 048 Women's Movement. Is a right cause. Feels some jobs are to difficult for women to handle, but believes in equal pay for the same job and work.
- 062 Childhood. Girls didn't need a education, but boys were encouraged to obtain an education.
- 072 Thelma helped pay for her college education (Annetta Daughter). She did household chores. She became a teacher.
- 093 Dreamed of teaching school, but never really pursued it.
- 100 Child rearing today. Believes that children need more discipline. Don't need a physical spanking but some form of verbal discipline followed by spanking if still don't mind and behave.
- 120 Changes she has seen. T.V., paved roads, bridges instead of fording rivers, from horses and wagons to cars, etc.

- 142 Discrimination. Never discriminated against as a woman. Comfortable in the roles she was put into.
- 166 Felt her daughter should be able to support herself.
- 172 Thinks family planning is very important.
- 185 Families with 12-14 children due to no choice, no birth control
- 190 Changes automobile have made, Makes traveling much faster and easier
- 207 Had a spring cleaning. Moved everything out and cleaned wall to wall.
- 210 When people sick, a doctor was available to help treat the sick. It was six to eight miles to the doctor.

242 Goes on about a forest fire.
- 263 Hasn't done much traveling, is afraid to. Did take one trip, which she enjoyed. Wouldn't mind taking trip again.
- Continues on about different things in her life. Is rather boring.
