Academic Course Credit (4 semester hours)

Undergraduates at the University of Idaho who are interested in spending a summer conducting independent research of their own choosing are invited to submit a research proposal to the Dean, College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences, for summer field studies at the Taylor Ranch Field Station in the River-of-No-Return Wilderness Area. Proposals may cover any area of natural resource management/ecology. Awards will be made on a competitive basis to persons submitting the best proposals. Proposals will be judged on the basis of innovation, literature search, detail in methods used, potential for attainment of objectives, and educational value. The emphasis may be resource and/or sociologically oriented.

Students whose proposals are approved will receive academic course credit under FWR 499, Section 01, Wilderness Internship, upon completion of the summer work and acceptance of a research report. Food, housing, air travel to and from the Taylor Ranch Field Station, and most equipment will be provided. An honorarium of \$800 will be awarded. Interested students are urged to discuss ideas with advisors and other faculty.
