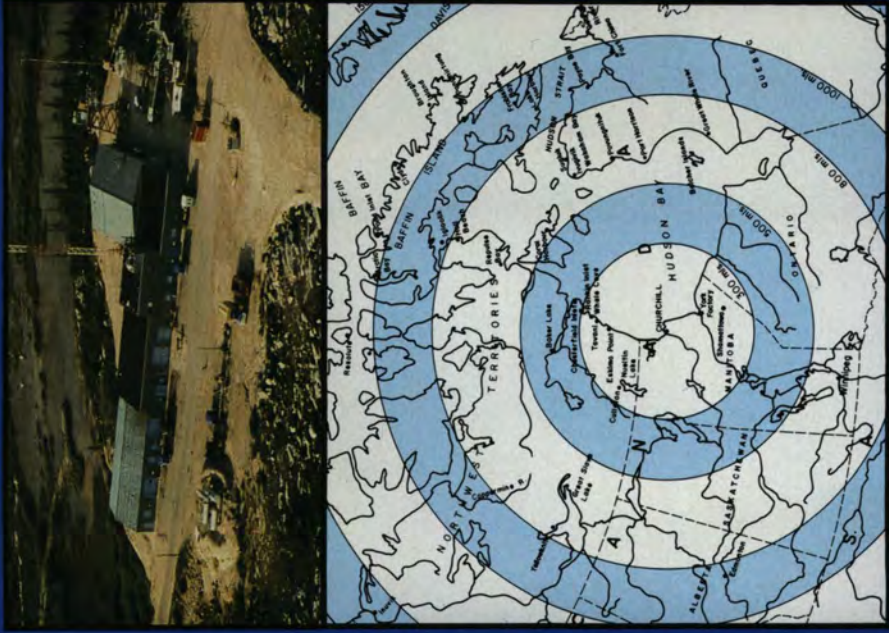

## WHAT IS IT??

The Churchill Northern Studies Centre (CNSC) was established in 1976 by the people of Churchill with co-operation from the government of Manitoba. It is a non-profit corporation with a mandate to facilitate arctic research and education. The Churchill region is a unique place to work as it is located at the intersection of three biomes: coastal, boreal forest and arctic tundra. As one of the oldest settlements in Canada and as the focus of previous international scientific programs, anecdotal and scientific data relevant to several disciplines is available. ## COURSES

An expanding variety of credit and non credit courses are offered at CNSC each year through cooperation with individual northern experts and universities. Credit courses encompass Ornithology, Arctic Ecology, Botany, Geology, and Climatology.

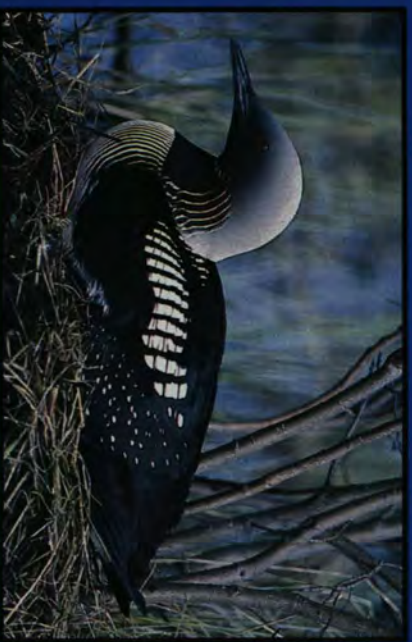

## LOCATION

The Centre is 20 km east of Churchill. This is an ideal location since it is less than 3 km from the coastal salt marsh, boreal forest or arctic tundra.



## RESEARCH

A broad range of research has been conducted at CNSC. Archaeologists, Biologists (Botany, Ecology, Genetics, Ornithology, Zoology), Geographers, and Linguists have all used the Studies Centre.



CNSC provides support for researchers who are involved in Polar Bear work. Logistical support, field assistance and specialized equipment is available on request.
