Dear Warren:

The Wilderness Research Center and the College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences would like to see the development of a special collection on "wilderness" in the University of Idaho Library. As Director of the Wilderness Research Center and Dean of the College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences, I strongly endorse this project. Would the University of Idaho Library be willing to establish a "wilderness special collection"?

The establishment of such a special collection would greatly enhance the management, research, and educational programs of the Wilderness Research Center, the College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences, the University of Idaho, state and federal agencies, and interested citizens. The University of Idaho could gain a reputation as the best institution for wilderness studies and our library as the most comprehensive source for wilderness literature.

According to our information (Ash, 1978)\* no other library in the U.S. has a special collection on the subject of wilderness. Such a special collection would be ideally suited to Idaho since Idaho currently has the largest acreage of wilderness and primitive federally classified land of any of the lower 48 states.

The initial start for a wilderness special collection is currently underway. Graduate student, Mike Hollmann, under Professor Hoffman, is compiling and collecting wilderness references for his M.S. project under the following general guidelines: (A thesaurus of terms Mike is using for indexing purposes is enclosed)

- 1. BLM Primitive Areas
- 2. Forest Service Primitive Areas
- 3. Roadless Area Review and Evaluation
- 4. RARE II
- 5. Legislation
- 6. Wilderness management
- 7. Agency regulations
- 8. Geog. area U.S. and Canada
- 9. Designated wilderness areas U.S.
- 10. State wilderness areas
