Inventoried Archaeological Sites

Dr. Frank Leonhardy, Masters students Robin Johnston and Frederick Thomas, and a field archaeology class inventoried archaeological sites during the summers of 1983 and 1984. Their objective was to determine settlement and subsistence patterns of the earlier inhabitants of the area.

Of special interest to Taylor Ranch visitors is the meadow site a mile downstream from the ranch on Big Creek where 33 Indian house pits are located. Artifacts collected from this site consisted mainly of stone implements for hunting and gathering and bighorn sheep bones.

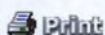
