WILDERNESS MANAGEMENT FIELD STUDIES

Special Program description for the Summer 1987 Bulletin

From the Taylor Ranch, the Univ. of Idaho's Wilderness Research Center Field Station, students will hike to the Middle Fork of the Salmon River, take a three-day backpacking trip, a three-day trip using pack stock, and live in the heart of the largest Wilderness in the lower 48 states. This unique two-week learning experience will introduce students to the history and philosophy of American Wilderness, the challenge of managing to protect the pristine environment, the latest techniques of low-impact camping, wilderness travel techniques, the basics of horse and mule packing, and the latest research investigating the wilderness environment.
