At the time of my appointment, Dr. Coonrod suggested that it might be desirable to establish a committee advisory to the Director of the Wilderness Research Center. I have given considerable thought to this, and should like to propose an advisory structure consisting of two committees.

The first of these committees would be an executive committee designed to be advisory to the director on such matters as inter-agency and public relations; promotion of funds and resources for the center; provide some direction on research needs, particularly as bearing on public attitudes and the problems of resource management agencies; and give council on faculty and facility development.

The second committee would be a technical advisory group capable of advising the director on such matters as: (1) specific research projects, (2) how best to perform and co-ordinate the research activities of the center, (3) specific facility and equipment needs necessary to carry out research objectives, and (4) faculty development.

The composition of these committees could take a number of forms. As a starting point, I propose the following:
