## NEW EDITION OF AWARD-WINNING STUDENT MAGAZINE NOW AVAILABLE

MOSCOW--The 1980 edition of an award-winning magazine covering western conservation topics published by students of the University of Idaho College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences is now available, according to Mike Hollmann, editor.

The magazine, "Idaho Forester: A Magazine of Natural Resources," includes articles about what the federal government plans for western wildlife in the 1980's, today's U.S. Forest Service fire policy, and a vision of Yellowstone National Park's future.

"If there is any one underlying theme to this issue," Hollmann says, "it is a focus on the 1980's and what the future has in store."

The "Idaho Forester" took first place for overall quality in a 1979 national contest for forestry student publications sponsored by the Society of American Foresters.

Other topics addressed in the 1980 edition include the Bureau of Land Management's wilderness inventory, new fisheries developing in the Snake River and the UI College of Forestry's initiation of scientific exchanges with Mainland China.

The magazine also serves as an annual for the college's students and contains articles about activities within the college and its faculty and students.

The magazine, edited by Hollmann and Lisa Strassheim, associate editor, relies almost entirely on sales to meet expenses. The "Idaho Forester" has been published annually since 1917.

Copies of the magazine are available for \$4.20. Mail orders will also be accepted and must include a payment of \$4.50 for each copy ordered, which includes a \$ .30 mailing fee.
