

Following is information and some suggested topics for the next WRC advisory committee meeting which I am calling for Friday, January 29, 3:30-5:30 p.m.

- A. The Bleak Endowment for wilderness-related, student research and education has provided \$15,000+ in matching funds to support student attendance at the 5th World Wilderness Congress. Criteria and process for selection are needed. Should a subcommittee of the WRC advisory board develop these, advertise the opportunity, screen applicants, and propose nominees to the full committee for approval. Cost to attend the Congress (two weeks) will be about \$1,000 for air \$1,500 transportation, \$1,000 for living expenses and \$250 registration for two weeks.
